SPOTLIGHT ON: BEETLEJUICE

The first show of the New Year at RBTL's Auditorium Theatre will be all about the ghost-with-the-most. "Beetlejuice," based on the Tim Burton classic, is making its way to Rochester February 14-19, 2023.

"Beetlejuice" tells the story of Lydia Deetz, a strange and unusual teenager whose whole life changes when she meets a recently deceased couple and a demon in stripes. On the surface, this musical, which is embarking on its first National Tour, has an irreverent book, an eye-catching, elaborate set and a versatile score. But, underneath (six feet under, to be exact), it's ultimately about family, love and making the most of every day.

In 2019, "Beetlejuice" received 8 Tony Award® nominations, including Best Musical, Best Book of a Musical and Best Original Score. Variety calls it "screamingly good fun! An eye-popping musical with off-the-wall humor, wickedly good tunes, endless visual delights, and (gasp!) even heart." The



delights, and (gasp!) even heart." The Hollywood Reporter adds it's "a riotous, rambunctious, spectacular production, with huge laughs, full-throttle performances and a mischievous sense of fun that literally seems to drip from the ceiling."

"Beetlejuice" is recommended for IO+, but parental discretion is advised as it contains strong language and mature references.

SPOTLIGHT ON: COME FROM AWAY

In a highly-requested return engagement, "Come From Away" is RBTL's second show in the M&T Bank Broadway season. After more than three years, this Tony Award®-winning musical will be back at RBTL's Auditorium Theatre December 6-II, 2022.



"Come From Away" tells a remarkable true story. On September II, 2001, as U.S. and Canadian airspaces shut down, 38 planes carrying 7,000 passengers around the world were diverted to Gander. Newfoundland, a small town that welcomed them in. Even though cultures clashed and high, nerves uneasiness eventually

turned into trust and gratitude turned into enduring friendships. On 9/II, the world stopped. On 9/I2, their stories moved us all.

"Come From Away" was written by Tony nominees Irene Sankoff and David Hein and directed by Christopher Ashley, who won the Tony Award for Best Director of a Musical in 2017. Entertainment Weekly says "it is a beautifully woven tapestry that needs each of its carefully considered threads to fully render its picture... I can't imagine a musical we need more right now than 'Come From Away'."


VIRTUAL TOUR OF RBTL'S AUDITORIUM THEATRE


You can now check out a 360 degree virtual tour of RBTL's Auditorium Theatre without having to leave your home! Thanks to <u>Visit Rochester</u>, RBTL was able to have a <u>Threshold 360</u> Creator come to the theatre to film using a 360 degree camera. Through the video, your "visit" begins outside the building, leads you into the lobbies and then inside to the theatre, giving you views from the orchestra and balcony levels and the stage.

Threshold 360 creates virtual, 360 degree tours of locations across thousands of U.S. cities. The organization says it operates around the idea that "there's a better way than static images to explore locations online, and to decide which thresholds to cross offline."
