




RBTL ANNOUNCES NEXT BROADWAY SEASON

RBTL'S AUDITORIUM THEATRE WELCOMES 68,000 PATRONS IN FIRST QUARTER OF 2023

RBTL has had a successful first few months of 2023, welcoming nearly 68,000 people since February 10. Throughout this time, RBTL's Auditorium Theatre hosted three touring Broadway productions, as well as several one night only performances. Almost 20,000 patrons alone attended performances of Disney's "Aladdin" during its run April II-16, joining "Beetlejuice" and the "Blues is Alright Tour" in reaching sell-out status.

RBTL's Auditorium Theatre also welcomed 2,250 area students between performances of "Hadestown" in March and "Aladdin" in April. The experience was part of RBTL's <u>A.R.T.S. Partners</u> education program, infusing the arts into the classroom. Throughout the school year, students were taught curriculum based on themes of an individual show. They then had the opportunity to see that show live on stage.

"After the last few years dealing with the pandemic lowering attendance and programming, it's incredible to see this many people coming back out to enjoy the Theatre," said RBTL Executive Vice President Linda Glosser. "We've seen returning patrons and both kids and adults attending for the first time. We hope to keep this momentum going to continue to bring a variety of live entertainment to the Rochester community."



In the coming months, RBTL is hosting more sold-out performances with "Guitars and Stars" in May and Jerry Seinfeld in June. Tickets are also still available at <u>Ticketmaster.com</u> or the Auditorium Box Office for "<u>Shen Yun</u>," coming May 6-7, and <u>Anthony Hamilton</u>, who is performing May 12. Plus, "<u>SIX</u>" and "<u>To Kill A Mockingbird</u>" round out the 2022-2023 M&T Bank Broadway Season in May and June, respectively.

PGA'S WANAMAKER TROPHY TAKES CENTER STAGE AT RBTL'S AUDITORIUM THEATRE



In April, RBTL hosted a meeting for <u>Visit Rochester</u> members and the PGA's Wanamaker Trophy made a special appearance. Attendees had the opportunity to take their picture with the famed trophy, which has the names of past PGA Championship winners etched on it. This is ahead of this year's <u>tournament</u>, which will be held in May at Oak Hill Country Club.

This will be the fourth time golfers and fans have come to the Rochester area for the <u>PGA Championship</u>. The first was in 1980, the second in 2003, and the most recent time being in 2013.



A LITTLE BIT OF HER-STORY: MEET THE QUEENS OF "SIX"

- First marriage: Arthur, Henry VIII's older brother, in 1501. He died a few months later.
- · Second marriage: Henry VIII in 1509 to continue the Spanish alliance.
- Only one surviving child: Mary, the future Queen Mary I.
- At one point, Aragon acted as regent of England while Henry fought in France.
- Henry, desperate for a male heir, tried to persuade the Pope to grant him an annulment of his marriage to Aragon, so he could marry Anne Boleyn. Due to her strong faith, Aragon refused to accept that her marriage was invalid. In fact, she's known for her dramatic speech to Henry when he had her brought to court to seek the annulment.

- Marriage: Henry VIII in 1533.
- Children: Elizabeth, who later became Queen Elizabeth I.
- Prior to becoming Queen, Boleyn was Aragon's lady-in-
- Eventually, it was the Archbishop of Canterbury who granted Henry a divorce from Aragon and Boleyn was crowned Queen. She's much remembered for bringing about England's break with the Pope, who responded to Henry and Boleyn's marriage with excommunication.
- Three years into their marriage, Henry had Boleyn, who had yet to give him a male heir, charged with treason, adultery, and incest with her brother - all of which she denied. She was convicted and beheaded at the Tower of London.

 Marriage: Henry VIII in 1536 – just II days after Boleyn's execution. Seymour is remembered as being the "only one [Henry] truly loved."

 Children: Edward, the future King Edward VI. Seymour's two brothers later fought over the regency of the then young Prince Edward, following Henry's death.

 Seymour was previously a lady-in-waiting to Aragon and then Boleyn.

- While still married to Boleyn, Henry sent Seymour a gift of money which she refused, apparently saying there "was no treasure in this world that she valued so much as her honor."
- Seymour developed complications following the birth of her son and 12 days later she died from a hemorrhage.

- Also known as Anne of Cleves. Anna is what she would have called herself in her native language (German).
- Marriage: Henry VIII in 1540 a move to form a political alliance. He chose her based on her portrait.
- When they first met, Henry was in disguise, possibly imagining some sort of romantic reaction. It was exactly the opposite. According to a witness, when Henry kissed Cleves, she turned away coldly from the stranger molesting her. The witness observed that he "never saw His Highness so marvelously astonished."
- Throughout their marriage, Cleves was often called unattractive and unsophisticated. It was this, and Henry's claim that her portrait didn't accurately depict her, that led to their divorce after six months.
- Cleves reluctantly accepted the divorce without protest.
 As a result, she was rewarded with a large income and property in England, where she remained until her death.

Marriage: Henry VIII in 1540 – 19 days after his divorce from Cleves.

- Howard was a lady-in-waiting to Cleves, was Boleyn's first cousin, and Seymour's second cousin.
- In 1541, Henry discovered Howard had affairs prior to their marriage. The first was with her music teacher when she was 13 years old. A year later, Howard began a relationship with the secretary to the Dowager Duchess. The two reportedly called each other husband and wife.
- While married to Henry, Howard began an affair with a courtier and distant relative. Historians believe that throughout all her relationships, Howard was used and abused by those with power over her.
- Following her arrest, an act was passed that considered it treason for a woman to become the king's wife without disclosing her unchaste life. Howard was then beheaded on the grounds of treason and adultery.


- First marriage: Edward Burgh in 1529. Second marriage: John Neville in 1534. Third marriage: Henry VIII in 1543. Fourth marriage (in secret): Thomas Seymour, the brother of Jane Seymour, in 1547.
- Before marrying Henry, Parr was in love with Thomas, but gave him up to marry the King. She was the only one of Henry's wives to survive their marriage to him.
- Parr was the first woman in England to write and publish books under her own name and in English.
- Parr was an evangelical protestant and staunch supporter of the English Reformation, which cut back papal power and influence in England. Her religious opponents tried to turn Henry against her and had a warrant for her arrest. However, Parr was warned of this and begged for forgiveness, which Henry accepted.
- Shortly after her fourth wedding, Parr became pregnant, but tragically died during childbirth.

STARS OF TOMORROW RECOGNITION CEREMONY IS FAST-APPROACHING

RBTL's <u>Stars of Tomorrow</u> educational program, Presented by <u>Palmer's</u>, Sponsored by <u>WROC</u>, and Underwritten by <u>Lake Beverage</u>, is now in its 25th year – and this year's Recognition Ceremony is right around the corner! Since the fall, a team of trained and qualified adjudicators have been evaluating 37 area school musical productions in IO categories. They then provide students and directors with written feedback and rubric scores in a variety of production areas.

On May II, during the Stars of Tomorrow Recognition Ceremony, recognition will be given to schools with the highest scores in each of the adjudicated categories. Participating schools will also have the opportunity to perform a selection from their musical on stage at RBTL's Auditorium Theatre. Additionally, select students recognized for leading roles at the Ceremony, are eligible to compete in Stars of Tomorrow NYC Bound on May 25 for the chance to represent Rochester at the National High School Musical Theatre Awards / Jimmy Awards.
