

RESTORATION EFFORTS CONTINUE AT THE AUDITORIUM

Restoration and renovation efforts are continuing at the Auditorium. Crews are still working on the original brass doors, which had darkened over time due to oxidization. Right now, Ethan Allen's Rothschild Lounge is boarded up, while those doors get restored. But don't worry, the Lounge will reopen in time for the first show of RBTL's M&T Bank Broadway Season – Disney's "Frozen" in September. However, progress is being made, as most of the main doors in the west lobby now shine like they did when they were first installed, nearly 100 years ago.





There is also some work being done outside of the structure. Stairs that were previously unusable on the Prince Street side of the building are being remodeled to now function.

RBTL is also continuing to work with Pike Construction Services, LaBella Associates, LeChase Construction and other community advisors on plans to improve accessibility and adaptability. The Auditorium Theatre will remain open and operational throughout the renovation and restoration process. The goal is to complete renovations by 2030, the building's IOOth anniversary. 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FINGER LAKES OPERA TO MAKE AUDITORIUM THEATRE DEBUT WITH PRODUCTION OF VERDI'S "AIDA"

The Finger Lakes Opera (FLO) is set to make its debut at the Auditorium Theatre with Verdi's "Aida," which will be presented on August II and I3. "Aida" is a story of love and betrayal against the backdrop of war. Egyptian Army General Radamès is chosen to lead the enemy assault against Ethiopia. He hopes, by being victorious, to win the hand of his lover, Aida, an Ethiopian enslaved to Egyptian princess Amneris. This will be FLO's first indoor mainstage production since their 2019 performance of "La bohème."



"In 2021, FLO did most of its productions outdoors as an added safety measure given the pandemic," said Finger Lakes Opera Executive Director, Elizabeth Long. "Having all productions outdoors almost doubled the work and definitely doubled the stress. It was always FLO's intention to go back to an indoor mainstage production and we're so happy to be partnering with RBTL!"

FLO is a non-profit performing arts organization, with its 2023 season marking its 10th year of performing. FLO was founded in Geneseo as an of SUNY Geneseo, moved to extension Canandaigua as it pursued non-profit status, but since 2021, has been based in Rochester.

"Although FLO has settled on Rochester as its base of operation, the company is still committed to performing throughout the Finger

Lakes region," said Long. "Since 2021, we've offered smaller scale productions in Canandaigua (children's operas, "Summer Scenes") and greatly expanded engagement services. Pre-pandemic, FLO generally provided three to four programs every summer, while this season, FLO will deliver six ticketed events throughout its summer festival and over 30 engagement events. That includes performances at elder care homes, community centers, and elementary schools. FLO believes that in order to attract new audiences, there needs to be a focus on bringing unique productions to non-traditional venues."

The journey to bring Finger Lakes Opera to the Auditorium Theatre wasn't the easiest. According to Long, there are very few venues in Rochester that can mount full opera productions. Originally, FLO was going to present "Aida" at another location, but that facility decided it didn't have the staff to manage or run an opera. That was when Long reached out to RBTL's Executive Director, Linda Glosser.

"From the very beginning, I've been impressed and grateful for the RBTL's professionalism," said Long. "FLO is excited to be presenting 'Aida' at RBTL, not only because the administrative and production staff there are incredible, but also because we are reaching new audiences and thus, addressing one of FLO's marketing goals, which is to 'bring more opera to more people.'"

To help fulfill that goal, FLO draws from diverse regions and backgrounds to create its "roster of mainstage and emerging artists." Long added that part mission is to present FLO's professional opera, and while that level of talent can be found in Rochester, sometimes the company does need to expand its search (both out of state and out of the country) to find the right singer or director. For FLO's summer festival this year, there is a combination of local talent and singers from around the world, including South Africa and Scotland. However, when it comes to their leading sopranos - both have Rochester connections. Kearstin Piper Brown, who sings the role of "Florine" in



the newly commissioned, one-act opera "Two Corners," lives in the City of Rochester and Elena O'Connor, who audiences will see in the role of "Aida," grew up in Penfield, but now lives in Germany.

"Aida" is led by Artistic Director, Gerard Floriano. FLO is partnering with Garth Fagan Dance and the Rochester Oratorio Society, who helped recruit chorus members, to bring this production to the stage. Long says of the seven Garth Fagan Dance artists, 34 chorus members and 34 orchestra players, all are from the Rochester or Buffalo area.


