RBTL ANNOUNCES FUNDRAISING COMMITTEE FOR ONGOING PERFORMING ARTS CENTER RENOVATIONS AND RESTORATIONS

RBTL has formed a <u>Fundraising Committee</u>, amid ongoing West Herr Performing Arts Center renovations and restorations. The group consists of well-known and influential individuals within the Rochester community. All of those involved understand and appreciate the importance of the arts and live entertainment as an enhancement to quality of life. The Fundraising Committee will work to secure funding for RBTL's ongoing renovation and restoration projects at the West Herr Performing Arts Center, which focus on enhancing accessibility and the theatre-going experience for both patrons and performers. Overall, renovations will cost an estimated \$75 million. It is RBTL's goal to raise \$35 million of that from within the Rochester region. In addition to local outreach, RBTL is working with the New York State Assembly and Senate, the Federal Government and Empire State Development to obtain available funds. Renovations are also being funded by operating surplus, sponsorships and Rochester-area foundations. \$14 million has already been committed to date.



"The support from the Rochester community has been gratifying beyond explanation," said RBTL CEO and Board Chairman, Arnie Rothschild. "Starting with West Herr, and every member of our state delegation, the City of Rochester, and so many others. The encouragement is both humbling and inspiring."

New York State Senator Jeremy Cooney added, "Rochester Broadway Theatre League's new fundraising team draws on decades of experience from leaders across our community. I can't wait to see what they accomplish and am excited for the planned renovations. RBTL means so much to our community and their plans will ensure that they'll keep bringing world-class performances to Downtown Rochester for years to come."

Rochester Mayor Malik D. Evans said, "The West Herr Auditorium Theatre and Performing Arts Center is a cultural hub and economic engine for Rochester, gathering residents and visitors alike. I look forward to the restoration and renovation so that it can expand its impact and accessibility and continue to add vibrancy to our city for generations to come."

Phase One of renovations and restorations continues to make progress at the West Herr Performing Arts Center. It includes major accessibility and adaptability construction in the form of elevator access to the second-floor balcony and loge in the West Herr Auditorium Theatre and reconfiguring the main floor of the former Auditorium Center portion of the building. Also part of Phase One, was RBTL's new operation of four area parking lots and restoration of several sets of historic brass doors, which had darkened over time due to oxidization. While both beautiful and historic, the complex as it sits, provides for many challenges. RBTL is partnering with Pike Construction Services, LaBella Associates, LeChase Construction and other community advisors to augment the existing Performing Arts Center spaces in the most optimal way. RBTL's goal is to complete renovations by 2030, the building's 100th anniversary.

JESUS CHRIST SUPERSTAR RETURNS TO AUDITORIUM THEATRE

The next Special Engagement of the 2023-2024 M&T Bank Broadway Season first appeared on the Auditorium Theatre stage in 1994. Now, almost 30 years to the day later, the production returns for the sixth time! "Jesus Christ Superstar" was the last Broadway show RBTL presented before the months-long shutdown due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Now, that tour returns April 8-10 – celebrating more than 50 years, with a new, mesmerizing production on the road.

"Jesus Christ Superstar" is set against the backdrop of an extraordinary series of events during the final weeks in the life of Jesus Christ as seen through the eyes of Judas. It has music and lyrics by Emmy, Grammy, Oscar and Tony winners Tim Rice and Andrew Lloyd Webber with a score rooted in rock music that includes "I Don't Know How to Love Him," "Gethsemane" and "Superstar."

This new production of the Broadway classic was originally staged by London's Regent's Park Open Air Theatre. It won the 2017 Olivier Award for Best Musical Revival, garnering unprecedented reviews and accolades. The <u>Chicago Sun Times</u> said, "This is not your grandmother's 'Superstar.' Drew McOnie's choreography has the explosive feel of barely contained ecstasy, filled with flailing movements that evoke old-time tent revivals, where snake handlers spoke in tongues and miraculously cured the sick. Tom Scutt's smoke-colored costumes give the piece a timeless feel, as does his towering, sleek, steel-and-scaffolding set. Stark and shadowy, lighting designer Lee Curan's work is so rhythmic it almost feels like a part of the orchestra."

The <u>New York Times</u> added, "Timothy Sheader's adrenaline-pumping production of Andrew Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice's "Jesus Christ Superstar" is ardently, honestly sincere. I haven't had so much fun listening to Mr. Lloyd Webber's score, his finest, and Mr. Rice's lyrics, his cheekiest, since I bought the concept album as a teenager."

"Jesus Christ Superstar" pays tribute to the historic 1971 Billboard Album of the Year, while creating a modern, theatrical world that is uniquely fresh and inspiring. It's been found to appeal to both theater audiences and concert music fans.

With a run time of 90 minutes, and no intermission, "Jesus Christ Superstar" plays the West Herr
