RBTL ANNOUNCES NEW PARTNERSHIP WITH ROCHESTER MUSIC HALL OF FAME AT WEST HERR PERFORMING ARTS CENTER

Earlier this month, RBTL announced that the <u>Rochester Music Hall of Fame</u> (RMHF) will be the first new arts organization to take up residence at the <u>West Herr Performing Arts Center</u>, since its renaming and reimagining. The partnership will provide RMHF with permanent exhibition space for public viewing for the first time in its 15-year history.

As stated when RBTL acquired the entirety of the Auditorium Complex in 2023, the vision is to restore and revitalize the six floors of the historic West Herr Performing Arts Center, and create a new, multi-stage, mixeduse venue for community arts organizations. This is coming to life through the ongoing efforts of **PROJECT** RESTOURATION, which aims to secure a dynamic future for the



arts in the Greater Rochester region, establishing a cultural legacy and inspiring generations to come. The Rochester Music Hall of Fame's commitment to making use of creative space at the West Herr Performing Arts Center marks the beginning of realizing RBTL's significant objective.

"A Performing Arts Center is a place to celebrate all of what we call the arts and entertainment, and the Rochester Music Hall of Fame is exactly the kind of presence that should be here and celebrated," said Rochester Broadway Theatre League CEO and Board Chair, Arnie Rothschild. "Great musicians need a place where their talent and hard work can be honored, and RBTL hopes to provide that."

RMHF recognizes those with ties to Rochester, whose talents, efforts, perseverance and creativity have contributed to the creation of musical excellence. To date, the Rochester Music Hall of Fame has inducted 68 local musicians, bands and industry professionals. By teaming up with RBTL, RMHF hopes to have a physical display at the West Herr Performing Arts

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Center by early 2026, highlighting its inductees through photographs, videos and music, as well as showcasing memorabilia from these exceptional artists.

We also look forward to music filling the magnificent performance spaces being uncovered and restored by RBTL, which is a major undertaking that we commend and enthusiastically support."

"I applaud RBTL and Rochester Music Hall of Fame for coming together in celebration of Rochester's rich musical heritage," said RMHF and Rock & Roll Hall of Fame inductee Lou Gramm, whose impressive career with Foreigner was sparked at the Auditorium Theatre when he met Mick Jones backstage after a concert. "I look forward to having a front-row seat to the many experiences that evolve from this exciting collaboration."

The partnership will also allow for the two organizations to further expand their arts education programs. RBTL currently offers several opportunities for local students in conjunction with its Touring Broadway shows, and RMHF board members regularly detail Rochester's rich local music history and industry job possibilities to area youth. Discussions for collaboration are already underway, which will include theatre-going school groups to be immersed in the forthcoming exhibits.

The West Herr Performing Arts Center was already home to <u>RBTL/West Herr Auditorium Theatre</u>, A Magical Journey Thru <u>Stages</u>, the <u>Rochester Theater Organ Society</u> and the <u>Rochester Musicians' Association</u> when RBTL acquired the Complex. RBTL is pleased to now welcome the Rochester Music Hall of Fame to the WHPAC arts and entertainment family!

Some more visible changes are being seen at the West Herr Performing Arts Center as restorations progress on the Rear/West Entrance and Performing Arts Center main lobby.

Framing can be seen going up along the outside of the building, where the accessible entrance/exit will be located. Inside, the stark hallway once decorated with blue carpeting is being expanded. THE WIZ TECHS AND RE-LAUNCHES TOUR IN ROCHESTER THIS FEBRUARY

"<u>The Wiz</u>" will make its debut in Rochester, February 22-28 at the West Herr Auditorium Theatre. This groundbreaking twist on "The Wizard of Oz," which in turn was based on L. Frank Baum's children's book, "The Wonderful Wizard of Oz," changed the face of Broadway – from its iconic score packed with soul, gospel, rock and 70s funk to its stirring tale of Dorothy's journey to find her place in a contemporary world. The L.A. Times said, "For a generation of Black Americans, this was the first time they saw people who spoke, sung and moved the way they did in a Broadway production, and later, a big-screen musical. It has become a kind of rite of

passage for the black community." Conjuring up an Oz unlike anything ever seen before, this production is a dynamite infusion of ballet, jazz and modern pop that will bring a whole new groove to easing on down the road.

"The Wiz" company will arrive in Rochester early for technical rehearsals prior to opening night. This will be a re-launch of the tour, which first performed a I3-city run before re-opening on Broadway in April of 2024. As this is the first tour of "The Wiz" in almost 40 years, we're taking a look at the history of the iconic musical, ahead of the production's return to the stage.

October 1974 – "The Wiz" begins performances in Baltimore, Maryland for a pre-Broadway run.

January 1975 – After previews in December, "The Wiz" officially opens at the Majestic Theatre on Broadway.

April 1975 – "The Wiz" takes home seven Tony® Awards, including Best Musical, Best Direction of a Musical (Geoffrey Holder), Best Original Score (Charlie Smalls), Best Costume Design (Geoffrey Holder) and Best Choreography (George Faison). The production also earned Dee Dee Bridgewater (Glinda) and Ted Ross (The Lion) their first Tony wins for Best Featured Actress and Best Featured Actor in a Musical, respectively. Holder was the first Black man to be nominated, and subsequently win, for Best Direction of a Musical and Costume Design. Faison made history by becoming the first African American to win a Tony for Best Choreography.

May 1977 – The production moves from the Majestic to the Broadway Theatre.

October 1978 – A film adaptation starring Diana Ross, Michael Jackson, Ted Ross, Mabel King, Richard Pryor and Lena Horne premieres.

January 1979 – After 15 previews, 1,672 performances and four years, "The Wiz" closes on Broadway.

September 2023 – "The Wiz" kicks of a pre-Broadway tour at the Hippodrome Theatre in Baltimore, Maryland.

April 2024 – "The Wiz" opens on Broadway at the Marquis Theatre – almost 50 years since it first took the stage.

February 2025 – "The Wiz" returns 'home' to stages across America in an all-new Broadway tour.

The production runs approximately 2 hours and 20 minutes, including an intermission. It uses haze, smoke and flashing lights. Tickets for "The Wiz" at the West Herr Auditorium Theatre are available at <u>Ticketmaster.com</u> or the Auditorium Box Office.

APPLICATIONS FOR FIFTH YEAR OF FAIRGAME GRANTS OPEN IN FEBRUARY

ARTS ORGANIZATIONS FROM THE CAPITAL REGION, CATSKILLS REGION AND SOUTHERN TIER SET TO BENEFIT FROM CASINO FUNDING OPPORTUNITY



RBTL is among prominent cultural institutions in New York State that make up the Upstate Theater Coalition for a Fairgame. It was established through a partnership between the State and the casinos in three gaming regions: the Capital Region, Catskills and Southern Tier.

Each coalition member is committed to enhancing its community by showcasing worldclass live events, promoting education, and ensuring accessibility for all. Driven by this dedication, the coalition launched the Fairgame Arts Grants program to support arts and

cultural organizations in its regions. Now, for a fifth year, the Upstate Theater Coalition is once again offering this funding for non-profit arts and cultural organizations. Eligible non-profits in 27 counties, which include Monroe, Ontario, Seneca, Steuben, Wayne and Yates counties, can apply for grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$5,000 to support creative programs that enrich their communities.

Since 2019, the program has awarded nearly 100 grants, distributing over \$300,000 to empower creative initiatives and enrich local communities.

"These organizations operate at the community level and have a direct impact on arts patrons in the Empire State," said RBTL COO and Upstate Theater Coalition President, John Parkhurst. "That we can support such incredible programs and help the arts come alive for our communities is an honor for all the performing arts centers and theatres in the Upstate Theater Coalition for a Fairgame and the Upstate casinos who support us."
